Do you feel as the writers do, that things are "out of control", speeding on to worse days? Why do you feel that way?

Isaiah talks of similar times some 600 years before the birth of Jesus, and offers us reassurance of God's awareness of our struggles, and hope for the future. The psalmist

offers us similar hope. Read these verses several times and sit with the words. What words of reassurance and hope do you take from these verses? Make note of these words, carry them with you into the new year, and take them our when you feel the need for God's reassurance.

Esther 4:13-14 "Mordecai sent this reply to Esther 'Don't think for a moment that because you're in the palace you will escape when all other Jews are killed. If you keep quiet at a time like this, deliverance and relief for the Jews will arise from some other place, but you and your relatives will die. Who knows if perhaps you were made queen for just such a time as this?"

Isaiah 43:1-3a "But now, O Jacob, listen to the Lord who created you. O Israel, the one who formed you says, 'Do not be afraid, for I have ransomed you. I have called you by name; you are mine. When you go through deep waters, I will be with you. When you go through rivers of difficulty, you will not drown. When you walk through the fire of oppression, you will not be burned up; the flames will not consume you. For I am the Lord, your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior."

Mordecai's words to Esther remind us that we are all called to be part of the solution to the problems we see in the world; none of us has the luxury of sitting on the sidelines — even if we live in a "palace" — when we see evil at work, because evil unchecked will come for us too. Isaiah reminds us that even in evil times, we are not alone because God walks with us. Where have you seen or felt God walking beside you? Describe what that was like. Spend some time considering the places you find yourself in, and the gifts God has given you that allow you to "shine bright, in a dark world that [needs] some light". Offer you thoughts about these, as well as any concerns you might have, to God, and listen for the Holy Spirit's guidance on how you are called to respond.
